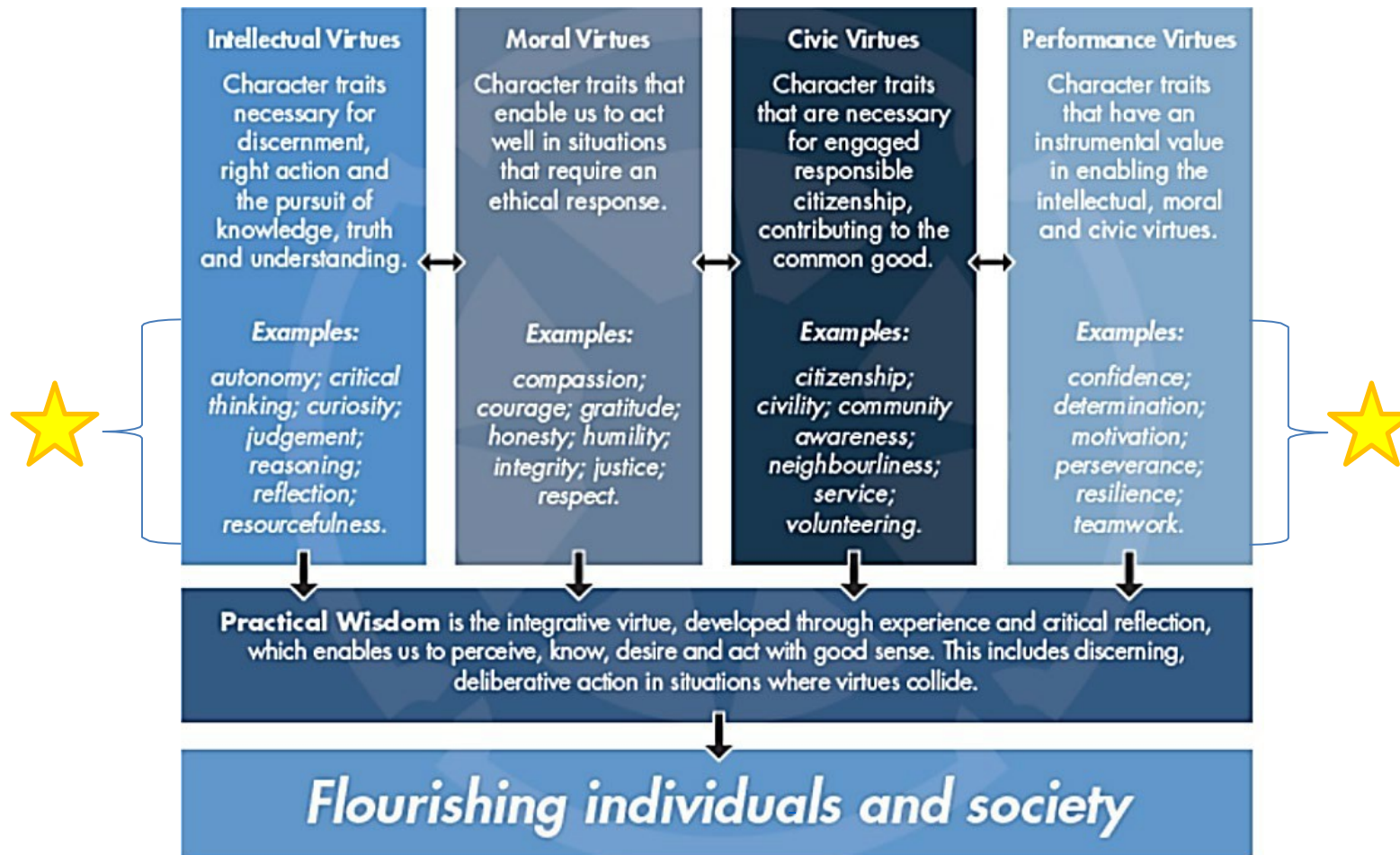
# About the Kern National Network for Caring & Character in Medicine (KNN)

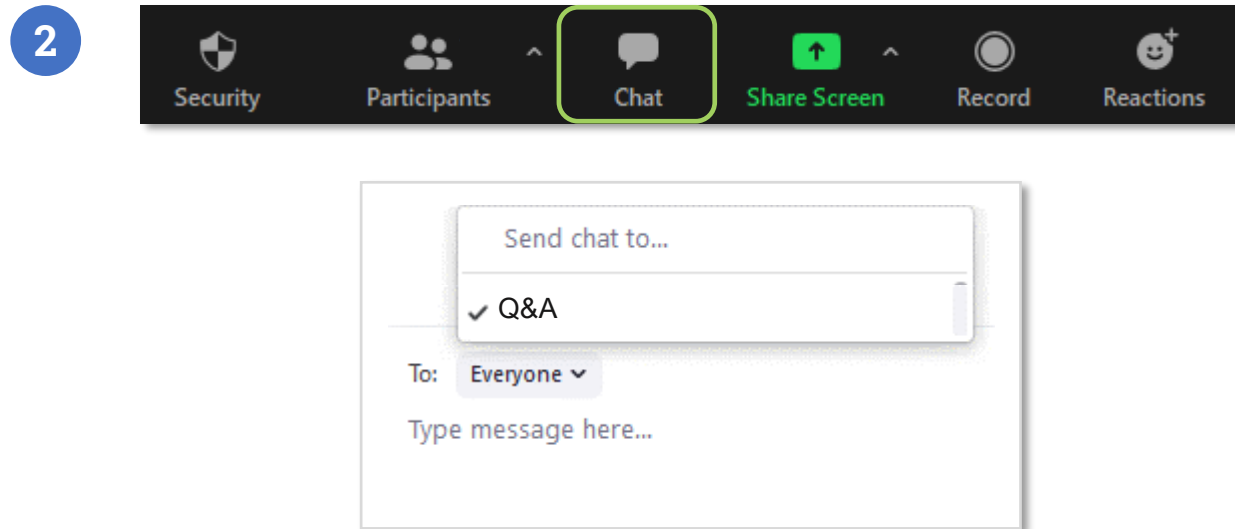
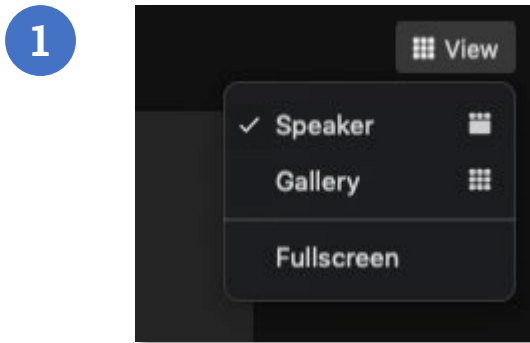
