- Examine how collaborative practice approaches can help those within care settings flourish.



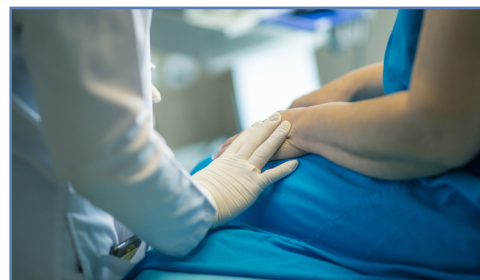
About the Discussion Series
