Her scholarly work aspires to support healthcare leaders, faculty, staff, students and patients in cocreating environments that reflect our professional values, promote learning and better serve our communities.

John Luk serves as the assistant dean for interprofessional integration at Dell Medical School, and works with colleagues and stakeholders to create experiences that will prepare graduates to be effective team players, communicators and leaders. On campus, he serves on the Health Interprofessional Practice and Education Steering Committee, helping to create the UT Austin Center for Health IPE.
