In collaboration with **seven** founding member schools representing **~3,500+** medical students, the KNN is working to impact the **entire life cycle** within the profession of medicine.



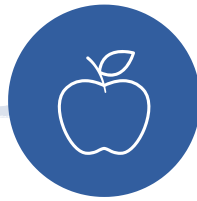

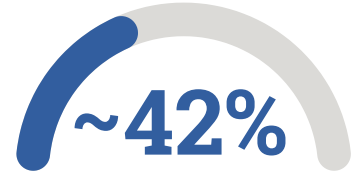
